

QUÉBEC'S SOCIAL ECONOMY

Quebec is a world leader in social enterprises.

WHAT ARE SOCIAL ENTERPRISES?

- Defined by the Social Economy Act
- Purpose is to meet the needs of their members or their community
- **Democratic** governance
- Not a public entity
- Principal types: cooperatives and non-profits
- Sale of goods and services
- Aspire to economic viability
- Redistribution of surpluses
- In the event of dissolution: property must be transferred to a similar corporation

WHAT IS A COOPERATIVE?

- Formed by people who come together to meet common **economic**, **social** and **cultural** needs
- Governed by members; one member, one vote
- **Types of co-ops**: consumer, producer, worker, multistakeholder, housing

WHAT IS A NON-PROFIT SOCIAL ENTERPRISE?

- Cannot distribute surplus funds to their members
- **Do not** pay income tax
- Eligible for government grants
- Also **member-controlled**, with mission beyond maximizing financial return
- · Must serve the greater community
- Larger purpose (philanthropic, charitable, educational, scientific, or social)
- To be a social enterprise: must have 40% of revenue as self-generated
